

SIGN CODE MEETING NOTES JAN 7, 2009

Transcribed from flip-chart notes:

1. Temporary Signage
 - A-Frames: Yes, but nice material & not dilapidated. One per business, not per location.
 - Sign “wavers/walker”, costumes, hand-held sandwich boards
 - Special Event Banners
2. Permanent onsite signs: LED signs in windows, yes
3. Directional signs on US 19 and downtown, maps
4. Vehicle Signage: OK while driving around doing normal business
5. Signs need to be visible when foliage is full (new plantings obstructing)
6. Signs should be “framed” either painted or physical border
7. Size and height need to be reasonable (downtown)
8. Need a brochure (with diagrams) to show business’ what is allowed
9. Need directional signage downtown at major intersections (similar to Dunedin)
10. A-Frames: have a set of uniform sign options to choose from
11. Periodic banners for onsite events
12. Garage sale signs: don’t pull until after event (code enforcement), have a “sticker system” to show who has pulled a permit (goes on signs); allow signs on adjacent streets?
13. Special Event Signage; Banners in multiple locations (currently only allowed onsite)
14. What is a temp sign?
 - Banners
 - A-frames should be professional
 - Election type signs
15. Wrapped Vehicle Signs
 - If a business in the area, OK while you are there
 - If broken down, put a sign on car and notify police
 - Must be doing business close to car

16. A-Frames: Burma-Shave style signs in front of Winn Dixie (merchants buy).
Signs must be effective!
17. Banners: Permit 5 times a year, Totem Post?, Flag Banners
18. Permanent Signs: Different kind of signs for different uses
19. Additional free-standing signage for double frontages
