PLACE ITEMS SUCH AS THE FOLLOWING AT THE CURB BY 7:00A.M.

Furniture, Mattresses, Small Bulky Household Items
Carpet & Padding (cut & bundle in 4' sections)
Oven, Washer, Dryer, Microwave

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP:

Tires, Yard Waste, Propane Tanks, Air Conditioning Units
Construction Material over 4'
Refrigerators, Freezers, **NO** Electronics or Chemicals



USED TIRES, NO RIMS!

As part of this special clean-up service, the City of Tarpon Springs will accept used tires at the **Yard Waste Facility**

On Friday, April 3rd from 7:00a.m. until 4:30p.m. and Saturday April 4th 7:00a.m. until noon.

You **must** bring your City of Tarpon Springs Utility bill along with your driver license. You may bring no more than 4 tires **off the rim** per household. Over 32" must be cut in half.

Household Electronics & Chemical Mobile Collection

Saturday April 4th at the Tarpon Springs High School 1411 Gulf Road.

What to bring

ELECTRONICS: Cell phones, computer towers/CPUs, drives (e.g. hard drives, CD drives), laptops, monitors, rechargeable batteries (remove from device, place device in garbage), smart phones, tablets, televisions (must be whole).

CHEMICALS: Automotive fluids, batteries (household or vehicle), cleaners, cooking oil, fertilizers, fluorescent bulbs and other mercury-containing devices, fuels (e.g. gasoline, kerosene), fungicides, herbicides, insecticides, motor oil, paint (latex or oil), paint remover, paint thinner, pesticides, pool chemicals, rechargeable batteries (including vehicle), smoke detectors, solvents, wood preservatives.

What Not to bring

A/C units, alkaline batteries, appliances, biological/infectious waste, camcorders, CD players, copiers, digital cameras, DVD players, empty paint cans, explosives, fax machines, fire extinguishers, garbage, gas cylinders larger than one pound (e.g. propane tanks), GPS units, marine depth finders, medicine, microwave ovens, pagers, portable players, printers, printer/toner cartridges, radioactive waste, radios, stereo equipment, telephones, tires, VCRs, video game players.
