

Preliminary FIRM generally shows reductions in Base Flood Elevations (BFE) along the Gulf Coast of Pinellas County, with increases in BFE along the Tampa Bay Coast. These maps are not final and subject to changes.



CRS Class:

Community Rating System (CRS) provides flood insurance premium discounts for community efforts beyond the minimum floodplain management requirements.

The Class 6 rating can reduce flood insurance premiums up to 15%.
