



BUSINESS ACTIVITY

In the 2019-20 year within the CRA:

- Relocations or Closings
 - The Court of Two Sisters sold its building at 153 E. Tarpon Ave. and relocated to 134 E. Tarpon Ave. 153 E. Tarpon is under renovation for new tenants.
 - Consign & Design relocated from 100 S. Pinellas Ave. to 167 E. Tarpon Ave. Olympic Realty moved into 100 S. Pinellas.
 - Unique Finds closed in late 2019. The building was sold and is being renovated for Catalina's La Cantina
 - Custom Prints/Tarpon Art Gallery closed in early 2020, replaced by The Wine Society which opened in May 2020.
 - Mingo Mania closed in 2019, replaced by Bohemian Lotus Yoga Studio in 2020.
 - KCQue BBQ closed in 2019 and H'ours Creole Smokehouse opened in Nov. 2019
 - Save a Lot closed in January 2020 and Tarpon Springs Discount Grocery opened in August 2020.

INCENTIVE GRANTS

INCENTIVE GRANTS

CRA Façade Improvement Grant

- 50% reimbursable capped at \$10,000 for a single story and \$15,000 for a twostory building
- Created in 2011 Approved 81 Grants, 8 in 2019/20

CRA Restaurant Recruitment Grant

- 50% reimbursable capped at \$7,500
- Created January 2015 Approved 17 Grants, 3 in 2019/20

Building Code Assistance Grant

- 50% reimbursable capped at \$7,500 for a single story and \$10,000 for a twostory building
- Created March 2020 Approved 2 Grants






GRANT FACTS

Façade Grants – 81 Approved

- 77% (62) applied for by building owner
- 23% (19) by business owner
 - Of the 19 business owner grants, 90% (17) remain in operation.

Restaurant Grants – 17 Approved

- 35% (6) applied for by building owner
- 65% (11) applied for by business owner
 - Of the 11 business owner grants, 82% (9) remain in operation
- Building Code Assistance Grant 2 Approved
 - One from building owner; one from business owner



ECONOMIC IMPACT

- 100 Projects
- Total Grant Funds Expended → \$614,390
- Total Private Investment Made → \$3.8 million
 520% ROI over 9 years
 Average Grant Amount = \$5,800
- 39% increase in Assessed Value from grant year to current year for buildings receiving grants.



INCENTIVE GRANTS: GRANT SURVEY

PROJECT:

On-line and phone survey to 100+ CRA businesses – 53 respondents

81% were aware of all or some of the 3 incentive grants

48% had received a grant.

45% felt the grant amounts were satisfactory; 33% did not know/no opinion


